Dear Friends,

As I sit in the study to write this Pastoral letter the sun is shining and all around the beautiful signs of the Spring season can be seen. The new buds of the trees now blossoming into rich green leaves and blossom. There is a feeling of joy as we look forward and anticipate the better days of summer (even if it is warmer rain).

We also have so much to look forward to as we approach Easter and this truly wonderful Christian Celebration of Our Lord's Resurrection from death, and the promise of new life in and through Him for all who believe and have faith in Him.

However, before we reach this Celebration, we reflect through Holy Week how our Lord was betrayed, denied and abandoned by his disciples; how Jesus was arrested, tried and convicted by the Roman authorities and religious leaders; how it was the crowd of onlookers who were ultimately given the choice as to Jesus' punishment and - encouraged by the Jewish religious authorities - they shouted for his execution on the cross.

Jesus was crucified on the Friday that we refer to as Good Friday, but it was a dark and sorrowful day for humanity as an innocent man went to his death, his dying cry – "Forgive them Father".

We know that the story did not end here, but on the Sunday morning some women who went to the tomb into which Jesus body had been placed discovered that the large stone that had been placed in front of it had been moved and, looking inside, they found only His graveclothes. As they puzzled over this an angel appeared to them and told them that the one they were looking for was not there, but that Jesus had been raised from death and they were to go and tell the grieving disciples the Good News.

This is the Good News we too celebrate and share with others on Easter Sunday and like many congregations all over the world we will sing that wonderful Easter Hymn -

Thine be the glory, risen, conquering son, endless is the victor though o'er death has won;

angels in bright raiment rolled the stone away' kept the folded graveclothes, were they body lay. No more we doubt thee, glorious Prince of Life;

Life is naught without thee: aid us in our strife;

Make us more than conquerors, through thy deathless love:

Bring us safe through Jordan to thy home above.

Thine be the glory, risen, conquering son,

endless is the victor though o'er death has won;

Join with us in person or online and celebrate the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love that the Easter Message brings to each one of us.
